About the IPA

The Institute for Public Architecture uses design to challenge social and physical inequities in the city.

We address urgent issues of design and policy by mobilizing our network of activists, professionals, government officials and community stakeholders. The IPA's collaborative process involves our focused design residency and related programs.

We are proud of what we've accomplished this past year:

Book Launch

This August we published *Live/Work for the Workforce*, the first in our research and design series. These publications provoke dialogue by exposing the work of our IPA Residency Fellows, alongside contributing essays from academics and practitioners.

2018 Summer Residency

We hosted our third Residency program in 2018 in Queens, the largest and most diverse borough in New York City. The Fellowship included three public events at the Queens Museum, our residency partner, including a panel discussion at the LICArts gallery, team meals at various locations, community walking tours with local historians Quilian Riano and Daniel Karazas, and trainings with our collaborators Gehl Institute, Noguchi Museum, SimCenter and the NYC Department of City Planning.

Other Programming

We hosted our annual Cocktails & Q+A and invited Richard Plunz and Nina Rappaport to be in conversation with the IPA community.

We launched a newly designed content driven website.

Currently, we are preparing our 2020 programs including Open City, design collaborations, and panel discussions. With your support, we will be able to continue this programming.
